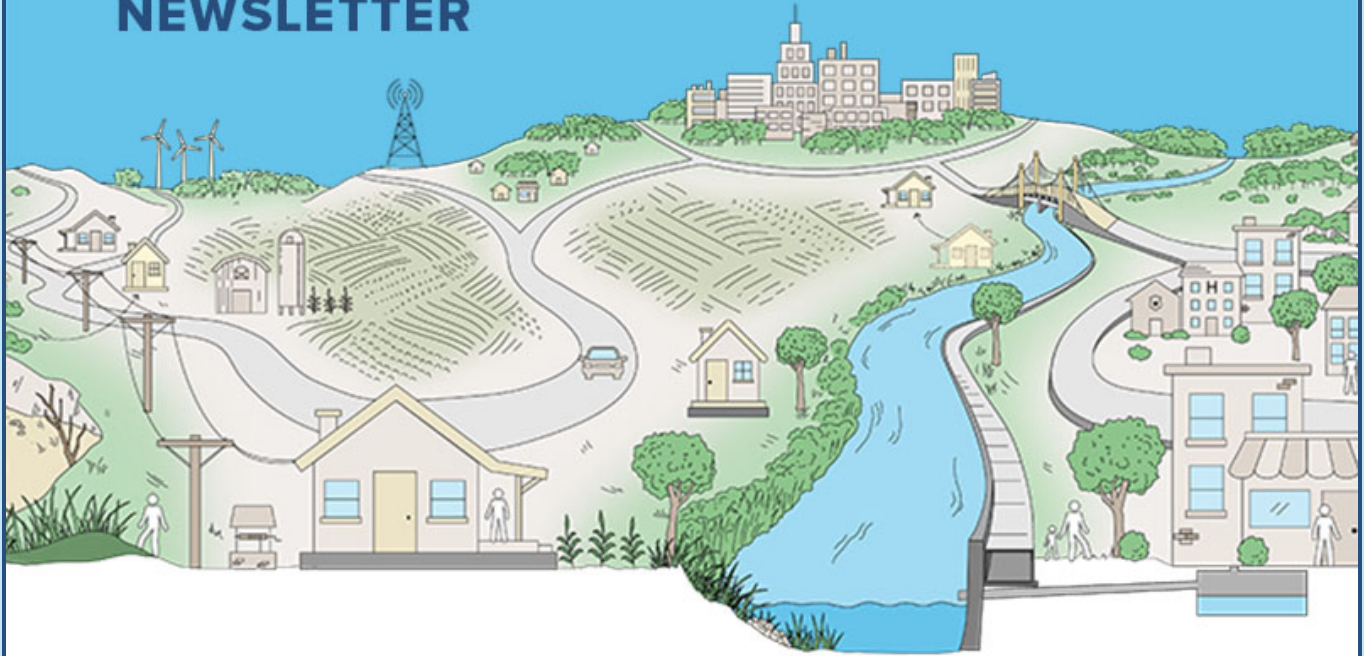

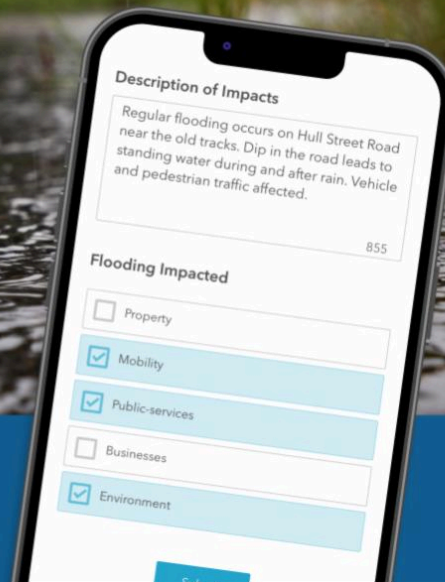
The Virginia Flood Protection Master Plan

We have selected a highly skilled consulting team led by Arcadis to spearhead the development of this crucial plan. The collaborative planning process will begin at DCR's Annual Flood Preparedness Coordination Meeting, scheduled for Thursday, September 26, 2024.
