Dear Hunter,

Thank you for choosing to participate in the Shenandoah River State Park Deer Hunt. Enclosed in this packet you'll find the following information:

- A non-transferrable reservation confirmation email
- Terms and Conditions
- A required items list
- Hunt map

Please carefully review all the documents in this packet. Each hunter will need to sign the Terms and Conditions sheet to confirm they have read, understood, and will abide by the stated conditions. Hunters under the age of 18 must also have a parent/guardian's signature.

We encourage you to visit the park 8:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. (Saturday-Sunday) to familiarize yourself with your stand/zone location. During your pre-hunt scouting trip, please park in designated parking lots and not along roadsides. No weapons are permitted, no marking or tree stands may be placed. Normal parking fees apply. If help is needed, please come by or contact the park office for assistance.

The park will open for hunter check-in at 4:30 a.m. All hunters must check-in at the maintenance shop by 5:15 a.m. Late arrivals will forfeit their reservation to stand-by hunters. A stand-by drawing will be held at 5:30 a.m. to fill any vacant zones. A mandatory pre-hunt safety briefing will take place at the check station at 5:45 a.m. Hunters must checkout at the maintenance shop by 6:00 a.m. and will be released to travel to the assigned zone. A second stand-by drawing will be held at 1:00 p.m. to fill any zones that are vacant at that time. You are welcome to come any or all days of the hunt, to hunt stand-by.

Shenandoah River State Park Managed Deer Hunt Permit

2026 Terms and Conditions

The following information, terms, and conditions apply to the managed deer hunts in Virginia State Parks. Any violation will result in revocation of permit and elimination of your participation in any hunting programs sponsored by the Division of State Parks and possible criminal charges.

1. The special deer hunt will be held on 3 November.
2. The park will open for hunter check-in at 4:30AM on the day of the hunt. All hunters must check in by 5:15AM. Participants arriving after 5:15AM will forfeit their permit to hunt. A stand-by drawing will be held at 5:30AM to fill any vacant zones. A second stand-by drawing will be held at 1:00PM to fill any zones that have been vacated by hunters in the mornings. If there are open positions within a zone the morning of the hunt, hunters with reservations have the option of changing zones prior to the standby drawing.
3. All hunters must check-out.
4. Participants must be at least 16 years of age, or if 12-15, accompanied by a responsible adult who has a hunter education certificate. The adult will not be allowed to hunt.
5. All hunters will attend a mandatory pre-hunt briefing the morning of each hunt at 5:45AM and hunters will be released to travel to their assigned zone by 6:00AM. Hunters who do not attend the briefing will not be allowed to hunt.
6. Scouting is recommended. No weapons are permitted, no marking or tree stands may be placed. The park is open for scouting between 8:00AM and 4:00PM (Sunday-Saturday). Park staff will be on hand to direct you to your designated zone and answer any questions you may have.
7. All required Virginia hunting licenses apply and will be checked prior to hunting.
8. Hunters will be required to have taken and passed a hunter safety course. Proof of hunter safety certification must be presented on the day of the hunt. No hunter will be allowed to hunt without proof of having completed a hunter safety course.
9. Every hunter or person accompanying a hunter shall wear either blaze orange or blaze pink hat and upper body clothing visible from 360 degrees.
10. Primitive weapons only will be permitted (muzzleloader); no rifles, handguns or weapons of any other type will be allowed.
11. There will be no shooting from or across roads, across water, or across park boundaries.
12. In accordance with state hunting laws, hunting hours are one-half hour before sunrise to one-half hour after sunset.
13. Weapons must be unloaded at all times when outside of the hunter's assigned hunting area. Muzzleloaders are considered unloaded when the cap is removed from the nipple.
14. Hunters should use GPS enabled cell phones or GPS devices to confirm their assigned zone boundaries rather than marking trees with tape.
15. Only deer may be harvested in accordance with the Code of Virginia. No other game species may be killed during this hunt.
 - This hunt is located within Disease Management Area 1 (DMA1) for Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD). Whole deer carcasses and carcass parts containing brain and spinal cord tissue from deer harvested in DMA1 can ONLY be transported within the counties in DMA1. The park does not have the facilities to process/butcher deer carcasses. 16. Hunters may take four deer, three of which must be antlerless. DMAP tags will be used on antlerless deer harvested. Hunters must use their Big Game Tag on any antlered deer harvested.
 - a. Warren County is an Earn a Buck County.
17. Deer will be field dressed no less than 100 feet from hiking trails, structures, and roads. All deer must be checked by park staff at the deer check station. Information will be collected on each deer, including removal of a jawbone.
18. Hunters may track and recover their deer while they are within their assigned zone. Hunters must request assistance from the hunt manager to track and recover any deer that has traveled into another zone that the hunter has not been assigned.
19. Hunters will be allowed to use portable tree stands at approved locations; however, safety harnesses are required. Screw peg steps will not be allowed. Trimming of trees for shooting lanes or to secure stands is prohibited.
20. If using a ground blind, blaze orange or blaze pink is required to be visible on the blind from 360 degrees, in addition to the blaze orange or blaze pink worn by the hunter.
21. Baiting is prohibited. Artificial deer lure is permissible.
22. Hunting with dogs is prohibited.
23. No drugs or alcoholic beverages.

25. The Division of State Parks reserves the right to close the managed hunt or to close any zone in the event that the number of deer taken exceeds that which is needed for herd control.
26. All Federal and Virginia Hunting Laws and Regulations, as well as Virginia State Parks Regulations, are applicable during this hunt. Hunters who violate any of the above regulations will be subject to removal from the park and/or if the hunter is in violation of the Code of Virginia the hunter may be subjected to a Virginia Uniform Summons.

"I have read and understand the above terms and conditions for participating in this controlled deer hunt. I understand that a violation of any of these rules and regulations is a violation of Virginia Administrative Code 4VAC5-30-40 and may result in the revocation of my hunting permit for this hunt, and the elimination of my participation in any hunting program sponsored by Virginia State Parks for the remainder of this season and subsequent years. Any fees paid to date for such programs will be forfeited."

Required Items Checklist

Please bring the following items with you on the day of the hunt:

- ☐ Reservation confirmation letter.
- ☐ Signed copy of the Terms and conditions sheet.
- ☐ A valid hunter safety certificate or legible photocopy.
- ☐ A valid Virginia hunting license and Big Game license.
- ☐ A blaze orange or blaze pink hat and upper body clothing visible from 360 degrees.
- ☐ If using a portable tree stand, a safety harness per manufacturer's guidelines.
- ☐ If using a ground blind, blaze orange or blaze pink that is visible on the blind from 360 degrees.

Field Maps Instructions



To fully utilize the benefits of the digital copy of the map, hunters should download the free app named **'Field Maps'**. This app is available for both Android and iOS. This app will allow you to use the hunt map in a similar manner to Google Maps or other mapping software. You will be able to geo-locate yourself on the hunt map, as well as drop point markers. This will allow you to better locate your stand as well as mark any areas of interest you may want to revisit if you are attending a zone hunt. One of the benefits of this app is you do not need phone service. The map is saved onto your phone and all you need to navigate is a GPS signal.

- 1. Visit your app store (Google Play or Apple's App Store) and search for 'Field Maps'.**
- 2. Download and install the app.**
- 3. Press "Skip sign in".**
- 4. In the search bar, search for the park in which you are hunting. For example, typing in "Lake Anna State Park" in the Field Maps search bar, will bring up the Lake Anna State Park map (the park map) AND the Lake Anna State Park Hunt map. You can then download the map for free within Field Maps.**
 - You may also press the link on our hunt website (<https://www.dcr.virginia.gov/state-parks/hunting>), which will directly link you to the download of that park within Field Maps.
- 5. When you're in the park, open the Field Maps app, and choose the appropriate map. Your location will show up as a small blue dot within the map.**

NOTE: You may need to turn on "allow downloads with cellular data" in your phone's settings if you are not connected to wifi when downloading a map.
